#### **Public Policy**

This will be my last communication as Public Policy Chair. I have enjoyed serving and overseeing Public Policy for the Amsterdam Gloversville Johnstown Branch since 2001. My Public Policy experience dates back to 1982 in New Jersey. AAUW Public Policy was beginning to establish itself as a national voice for women in the eighties. Roe v Wade had given women the freedom to choose safely. Careers were opening up to women that had previously accepted only token representation. AAUW was becoming a household word coming through television with newswomen, such as Diane Sawyer, using our research statistics and observations. The New Jersey Division (which would later be referred to as State) was in the forefront in the drive to bring awareness of educational inequalities for girls in public schools. AAUW was the first to advocate for girls in sex discrimination cases in schools.

Today we find the AAUW Public Policy program still endorsing the same priorities; however, policy has become more intense and directed toward the discrimination in funding of educational programs for women and girls and preserving the hard fought for programs and benefits that now exist. AAUW has moved from public consciousness raising to lobbying the policy makers in Washington. Two hundred thousand voices and votes must be heard, and the way to ensure this will be to maintain members and seek to increase their numbers.

Helen Martin has offered to take over as the new Public Policy Chair and she will do an excellent job of keeping the branch informed and active on the Public Policy front. --Michele Acquaro

#### Sister to Sister Summit--May 16

After all the hard work these past several months, the 12th annual conference for middle school girls is about to be happen. A total of 193 girls from 17 schools in the tricounty area have registered for this year's Summit. Patsy Suydam with assistance from husband Tom has computerized the registration process saving hours of cutting and arranging strips of paper to sort girls into workshop choices. Patsy has been handling all the computer chores with great creativity and has provided new ideas for the tasks that need to be done for a conference of this size to run smoothly. She has also connected us with a new music workshop for the Summit. Linda Bumpus has done a great job getting new funding sources for the event including Nathan Littauer

Hospital which has printed the registration forms and programs for the Summit and is funding our Capnote Speaker Deborah Borie. Linda has also taken care of obtaining funding from previous supporters of the conference by obtaining \$1,000 from Stewart's Shops for commemorative t-shirts and applying for a \$700 grant from the Montgomery County Youth Bureau. In addition, she obtained donations from several area businesses and organizations as well as food donations for breakfast snacks. She also arranged a tour of the new clean room at FMCC for chaperones who attend the Summit. Meanwhile, long time Sister to Sister Summit volunteers Melanie Pombrio and Susan Summerfield once again efficiently handled distribution of the information packets to the schools and collection of the student registrations, workshop choices, and t-shirt sizes.

Now that the programs have been printed, the t-shirts have been ordered, and the girls sorted into their workshops, the next step is preparing the registration folders for the girls and chaperones. Maps, schedules, and programs will be added to the folders by Fonda-Fultonville students under the direction of Teresa House and Paula Carnevale.

On Sunday, May 15 at 3 p.m. volunteers will help put up the workshop signs Patsy has made, distribute the balloons Linda will purchase to mark the way to the classrooms, hang the inspirational posters made by past attendees and saved by Anne Campos, and count out the t-shirts for each school to take home.

On Monday, May 16, bright and early, Linda will pick up the breakfast snacks donated from area grocery stores to be set up in time for the first arrivals at 8 a.m. A few more volunteers are still needed to help with the early morning tasks. Please contact Linda or Patsy if you can help on Monday, May 16 with breakfast setup, registration, directing students to their workshops, lunch assistance, or clean up. The event times are 8:15 a.m. until 1:30 p.m.

#### **Convention Report**

What a lovely trip to Glen Cove, Long Island. Met lots of interesting people and got lots of good information and ate lots of great food. There were 112 attendees representing 19 branches. NYS has 2889 members. The theme this year was My Sister's

Keeper. There was a wonderful talk about modern day Cuba where women and men experience little or no discrimination, and the education system is excellent. Also there was a talk about Israel and one about India and also Haiti. We toured Teddy Roosevelt's Sagamore Hill and heard his life story. We took 2 baskets to be raffled for LAF and returned with 2 that we won. I attended a workshop on how to achieve pay equity through gender equality awareness. Part of the problem is that jobs historically held by women and persons of color have had low salaries and still have them. If these salaries were raised to those of positions of comparable worth for men, then working women's families would gain \$4000 per year. Median weekly salary for women is \$669 and for men is \$824. We are STILL at 77 cents on the dollar! There are a bunch of websites to look at:
