October Meeting/ District IV Conference Follow Up

Our October 27 joint branch meeting and District Conference at Schenectady County Community College (SCCC) was attended by 7 of our members. Ella Ryder, Ginni Mazur, Sandy

Lane, Liz Russo, Anne Campos, Bonnie Van Wie and Carol Cownie attended and Carol brought along a friend also.

SCCC Assistant VP for Administration, Susan Beaudoin, welcomed us and provided a history of the college which was established in 1967 on the site of the old Van Curler Hotel. The site was placed on the Historic Register and recently won an award for renovation of Elston Hall where we met in the Van Curler Room for the conference. The topic of the Conference was "Violence Against Women and Girls: Prevention/ Support/ Advocacy". This is also the focus of the NYS "My Sister's Keeper" 3.0 project.

Gwen Wright, the Acting Executive Director of the NYS Office for the Prevention of Domestic Violence spoke about her role of her office in advising the State Government, training professionals to deal with domestic violence and outreach to the public to provide educational awareness of the problem. The roots of abuse to women including male privilege, societal norms, legal protection, and religious dogma were explained. In addition, laws to help victims including the recently signed Omnibus Bill which provides better protection for victims and accountability of perpetrators were discussed.

SAVIN - the State Automated Victims Information Notification which provides victims and the court with notification as soon as an Order of Protection has been served was also explained.

Tracey Brunecz, Special Victim's Bureau Chief for the Schenectady County District Attorney's Office provided a local prospective on the issue of Domestic Violence. She explained the difficulties in getting convictions due to the reluctance of victims to pursue arrest of their attackers. Changes in the criminal justice system are being made for "victimless" prosecution so that attackers can be arrested without the victim bringing the charges.

At the meeting, we also had an opportunity to shop for Fair Trade jewelry handcrafted by women in Uganda. Proceeds benefitted the Women's Shelter at the YWCA of Northeastern New York. We had a chance to view a display of masks designed by women in the Domestic Violence Support group to express their emotions.

Those attending also brought toiletry items which will be donated to the Women's Shelter. Lunch provided us with networking opportunities as we sat with members of other branches in attendance and exchanged ideas about programing and projects.

After lunch, Ella, Ginni, Sandy and Liz stayed to make earrings - one pair to keep and one pair to donate to the Women's Shelter. It was fun and a chance to express our creativity. Those of us who attended have many ideas to share.

AAUW Offers Princeton SAT Practice Test - Still Time to Sign Up!

There is still room available for any student who would like to take the Princeton SAT Practice Test on Saturday, **November 17.** Our branch is offering the opportunity to area High School students to help them

prepare for applying for college admission. Princeton will provide the service free of charge and we can use it as a fundraiser for our branch. We are charging \$10 per student for the service which includes two sessions; the test which will be administered from 9am-1pm on Saturday Nov. 17 and the follow-up 90 minute session which will take place on Wed. Nov 28 at 6pm.

Students participating should report to FM Classroom Building room C-130 by 8:45am on Saturday, November 17 with a pencil and calculator to take the Princeton Practice SAT Test.

Parents are invited to attend the second session in C-130 when students will receive their practice test scores and go over answers. In addition, strategies will be outlined for preparing for the actual SAT test which will be offered in the spring at area high schools. Both sessions will take place in the classroom building at FMCC. (See the attached flier)

Those participating will also have an opportunity to tour the campus and talk to recruiters while at FM. AAUW on FM Campus

We continue to keep our college connection with FM. The AAUW Student Organization participated in the college Club Fair October 1 and 2 and signed up 32 new AAUW e-student affiliates. These students are now connected to AAUW by e-mail free of charge since FM is an AAUW College/University Partner. Branch members Anya Biel, Darcelle Winchell and Liz Russo assisted with the recruitment efforts.

Presidential Debate Parties: Baked Goodies, Buttons and Bingo!

Our branch took advantage of the suggestion from AAUW to hold Presidential Debate Watching Parties on campus to reach the millennium voters. As a result, we registered with the National AAUW Action Fund and received "Get Out the Vote" buttons and stickers which we distributed to students who attended our first party.

Gwendolyn Ossenkop, Coordinator of Student Activities/ Director of the College Union helped to organize the initial event for the "Get Out and Vote" program. It was held as part of the Books and Bytes series in the cafe outside of the college library from 8-10:30 on October 3. John Roth, the Recreation Assistant, assisted with set up. During the hour before the debate, Jean Karutis played a political game with the students to help them determine the differences between progressives and conservatives and the political parties. Santa Pumpura, Student Government Treasurer discussed marketing techniques used to sell products and also used in political campaigns to sell candidates. Branch members Bonnie Van Wie, Darcelle Winchell, Carol Cownie, and Catherine Julius baked desserts for the party. These were really appreciated by students living on campus away from homemade goodies!

Audrey Egelston, Assistant Director of Residence Life helped to register new voters who attended and also assisted those who needed to request an absentee ballot. She also took care of submitting the completed forms to the Voter Registration Office.

Audrey proceeded to organize Debate Watching Parties for the last two Presidential Debates in the College dorm which attracted 25 students. At the final Debate Watching Party, the Presidential Debate Bingo Game provided by the AAUW Action
Fund was played. It encouraged
listening closely to the candidates speeches to hear phrases
and ideas covered. The heading
of each card (instead of BINGO)
was MYVOTE. The first person
to get six in a row was the winner. Listed in each square, for
example, were: Spending, Middle Class, National Debt, Medicare, Equal Pay, Social Security,
Jobs, DREAM Act, Title IX, Tax
Cuts, Healthcare Reform and
Ledbetter.

Audrey reported that "Students found it to be a lot of fun. It got students involved who hadn't attended the previous debates because everyone loves Bingo! It also got a dialogue going about what was in the squares (Ex. "What does Ledbetter mean?"). Audrey also commented that she "would love to do that Debate Bingo on a larger scale in Books and Bytes." In addition, as a result of the 3 Presidential Debate Watching Parties, a total of 62 students were registered by the October 12 deadline.

Late Breaking Pre-Election News!

Hurricane Sandy prompts state elections officials to extend absentee ballot deadlines.

The NY State Board of Elections has extended the deadline for mail application for an absentee ballot for this year's election due to the disruption caused by Hurricane Sandy.

The board approved a resolution extending the deadline "for an absentee ballot by mail shall be extended from no later than seven (7) days before the November 6, 2012 General Election to no later than four (4) days before the November 6, 2012, General Election."

They also extended the date by which a mailed absentee ballot must be received to be counted. The postmark must be no later than Nov. 5, but the receipt date is now by Nov. 19, an extension of six days. - AAUW-NYS GOTV / Counterpart Newsletter November 1, 2012

AAUW Empire State Virtual Branch Update

NYS AAUW founded the Empire State Virtual Branch last summer to provide a branch for Members at Large who do not live near an established branch or do not have time for attending branch meetings but who would like to take an active part in AAUW. Empire State Virtual Branch Board Meeting - Darcelle Winchell

I participated in the Empire Branch Board Meeting (by conference call) last night (September 18) and came away with some very cool ideas.

St. Vincent's College is working with their partner branch to "get out the vote" and that chapter has women in government come in and speak. They don't invite the ones currently running for office but they have managed to obtain at least one a year and the speech is always well attended. (This ties in with one of the speakers they had on the conference call who spoke on her research and work regarding women in politics – she said that there are more women Democrats than women Republicans but also that for each year the number of women in politics does go up although not much. She claimed in the 80's and 90's a lot of

woman decided to leave politics as it was felt that they were not accomplishing anything while serving).

Another chapter sponsored a contest in order to choose their "Nick Whistle" (NCCWSL - National Conference for College Student Women Leaders) participant. They had interested students write an essay on "Why Women Leaders are Important" and picked the best one.

The other speaker spoke on leaving Zambia and moving to Albany, NY and researching the violence and discrimination against Zambian woman. She is still helping out "at home – Zambia" financially but is now researching and working to bring wages and rights to woman there equal to what the males are getting.

All in all it was a new experience for me and very interesting. The branch worked on the bylaws and policies (as the ones applicable to physical branches do not really fit with a virtual, on-line branch) for the first 45 minutes and then went to the speakers and did questions and answers for the other 45 minutes.

Last year a group of us traveled to the Century Club's annual Festival of Trees in Amsterdam to enjoy the decorated trees, listen to music, enjoy lunch and shop. We hope to do it again this December.


