Highlights

- 1881 AAUW was founded by seventeen women from eight educational institutions
- 1967 Amsterdam-Gloversville-Johnstown (AGJ) branch of AAUW was formed to serve Fulton, Montgomery and Hamilton Counties
- 1972 AAUW played a key role in the passage of Title IX, which prohibits sexual discrimination in federally funded institutions
- 1988 AAUW is a leader in passing the Civil Rights Restoration Act
- 1991 AGJ branch established a scholarship for local high school seniors
- 1993 AAUW successfully advocates for passage of the Family and Medical Leave Act
- 1994 AAUW successfully lobbies for passage of the first Violence against Women Act
- 1999 AGJ branch established a scholarship for FMCC graduating women continuing their education in 4-year institutions
- 2000 AGJ branch started hosting annual Sister-to-Sister Summit for middle school girls from Fulton, Hamilton and Montgomery Counties at FMCC
- 2003 AGJ branch established an Excellence in Math and Science Award given to 8th grade girls in the tri-county area
- 2006 AGJ branch became a member of the Elizabeth Cady Stanton Women's Consortium to promote women's issues including education and history
- 2011 AGJ branch began working with FMCC and established an e-student affiliate organization
- 2012 AGJ branch held first Tech Savvy Summit for middle school girls
